Mr George Yeo has had a distinguished career spanning public service, business, and international engagement. He began his service in the Singapore Armed Forces in 1972 and rose to the rank of Brigadier-General before retiring in 1988. That same year, he entered politics and went on to serve in the Singapore Government for over two decades, from 1988 to 2011.

During his political career, Mr Yeo held several key Cabinet portfolios, including Minister for Information and the Arts, Minister for Health, Minister for Trade and Industry, and Minister for Foreign Affairs. He played a pivotal role in shaping Singapore's external economic relations, regional diplomacy, and cultural development.

Following his retirement from politics, Mr Yeo joined the Kuok Group in Hong Kong, where he was based from 2012 to 2021. In this capacity, he contributed to the Group's strategic initiatives and regional investments across Asia.

Between 2013 and 2020, Mr Yeo was appointed by Pope Francis to serve as a member of the Vatican's Council for the Economy, a high-level advisory body tasked with overseeing the financial and administrative structures of the Holy See. His involvement marked a significant intersection of faith, governance, and global stewardship.

Today, Mr Yeo continues to lend his experience and insights across various sectors. He is currently a Visiting Scholar at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, a Board Director of AIA Group and Pinduoduo (PDD), and serves as a senior adviser to several companies and academic institutions around the world. His thought leadership and cross-sectoral expertise remain highly sought after, particularly in areas involving global strategy, governance, and regional affairs.
